'Aspects of Social History of East European Jewry'



Many historians have focused on the history of East European Jewish elites (rabbis, writers, politicians etc.) and therefore given less attention to the realities of day to day life of East European Jews and the structures of the society of 'the masses'. This course will deal with selected aspects of popular life and will try to apply insights gained from the social sciences to better understand the dynamics of Jewish life and not just the specificities that made Jews different.

Shaul Stampfer (1948–) is the Edward Sandrow Professor of Soviet and East European Jewish History and former chairman of the Department of Jewish History at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. He is the author of *Lithuanian Yeshivas of the Nineteenth Century: Creating a Tradition of Learning* and *Families, Rabbis and Education: Traditional Jewish Society in Nineteenth-Century Eastern Europe* (both published by the Littman Library).
